Luweero diocese – This link has been active since 1996 when Bishop Evans visited Swindon during the Lambeth Conference.

A new bishop was consecrated in May 2015 following Bishop Evans Kisekka's retirement. It is a very rural diocese and the Cathedral complex dominates the small city from which the Diocese is

named.


Mission statement: Enable people in Luweero diocese to attain sustainable and abundant livelihood based on Christian values.

Kampala diocese - Though active in the past, this link has been dormant in recent years. The new bishop is keen to revive the link, so we can begin to form relationships with the people of Kampala and also Uganda Christian University in Mukono which is part of Kampala diocese.

Raising the roof

The benefices of Highworth and Blunsdon hosted Revd Godfrey Kasana in October 2014. Godfrey has an inspiring vision for providing secondary education in the village where he grew up, to avoid the young people having to walk 5 miles to the nearest school. The school now has 250 pupils aged 11-19. Some board at the school to avoid even longer walks and Highworth and Blunsdon helped Godfrey build the roof on the girls' boarding house. They also provided the doors and shutters for the windows which have just been fitted. Now the girls will be able to start sleeping in this building instead of camping in a classroom, as they have been doing.

Bishop Eridard has begun work and started writing the 5 year Strategic Integrated Grass Roots Development plan which will cover many areas including mission and ministry, education, community project, sanitation and women's empowerment.

Many churches have been planting trees during the rainy season, to improve land use, though some have been hampered by lack of seedlings.
